RECRUITMENT OF AN INTERNATIONAL STUDENT POLICY

The National Code of Practice for Providers of Education and Training to Overseas Students 2018 ('The National Code') requires the School, prior to accepting an international student or intending international student for enrolment, to make comprehensive, current and plain English information available to the international student or intending international student on specific matters outlined in Standard 2.1.

It is the School's policy to ensure that, prior to accepting international students for enrolment, the School will provide comprehensive, current and plain English information to the international student or intending international student on all matters required of the School by National Code Standard 2.1.

Course Information

The School's CRICOS course code for Secondary Years (7 – 12 VCE) is 016642A.

A course content outline is provided to an international student at the same time as the written enrolment agreement.

Mode of study at the School are:

- In person/face-to-face
- Work-based training
- Placements.

The course duration follows the School's term dates and are located on the School's website. The School's holiday breaks are at the end of each school term and are published on our website.

Upon completion of the course, the successful international student will receive VCE.

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Tuition and Non-Tuition Fees
