At Peninsula Grammar, we understand that our school community — comprising staff, students, and parents — is an invaluable source of insights and perspectives.





PERSONAL EXCELLENCE

In 2023, student achievement in NAPLAN changed to be reported against 4 levels of proficiency. This replaced the previous numerical NAPLAN bands and national minimum standards. The NAPLAN measurement scale and time series was reset in 2023. This means results from 2023 on cannot be directly compared to results from 2008 to 2022. From 2024, NAPLAN results will be able to be seen as a time series and be compared to previous years.

COHORT SNAPSHOT

The following information highlights the trends in student results from 2020 to 2023. The percentages highlight growth across the years.

15 Students (11%)

Received an ATAR of 95 or better, placing them in the top 5% of the state in comparison to 11% in 2022 and 12.5% in 2021.

28 Students (21%)

Received an ATAR of 90 or better, placing them in the top 10% of the State in comparison to 26.5% in 2022, 30% in 2021 and 26% in 2020.

54 Students (41%)


Received an ATAR of 80 or better, placing them in the top 20% of the State in comparison to 51.3% in 2022 and 48.5% in 2021.

Received an ATAR of 60 or better, placing them in the top 40% of the State in comparison to 85.2% in 2022 and 76% in 2021.



CHART 2: OUR COHORTS SNAPSHOT




POST SCHOOL DESTINATIONS

CHART 4: CLASS OF 2023



STUDENT ATTENDANCE

Robust measures are in place at Peninsula Grammar to ensure that student attendance is recorded accurately each year. Student attendance is recorded twice daily, at the beginning of each day and again after lunch. Any unexplained absences are followed up with parents via our administration support staff.

Parents are informed about the necessary process to apply for any leave greater than three days. Once granted by the Principal, the families are informed about the requirements to ensure that the students do not fall behind in their learning.

The whole school average attendance rate is 93.59%.

CHART 5: STUDENT AVERAGE ATTENDANCE RATE (%)






CHART 6: RECURRENT EXPENDITURE 2023





CHART 7: RECURRENT INCOME 2023









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
